

Local Primary Care, Public Health and Hospitals Adopt COVID-19 Navigation Tool

Tool helps navigate patients through points of care at right time, in right order

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Oxford County, ON – Local primary care, public health and hospitals have teamed up to launch the [COVID19 Population Health Navigator](#) to help physicians and nurse practitioners navigate patients in Oxford County through the important points of care in the right order and in the fastest time: the Ministry’s [self-assessment tool](#), [TeleHealth](#), doctors’ offices, assessment centres and local hospitals.

“The primary objective is to reduce the volume of unnecessary visits to assessment centres and emergency departments,” said Dr. Rachel Orchard. “We invite local residents and primary care providers to use this online tool now, which will improve care, reduce pressure on the healthcare system and provide public health with the insights needed to reduce the spread of COVID-19.”

This easy-to-use digital tool will connect primary care providers with the people who need their help the most and help them follow the right processes and guidance based on their patient’s unique circumstances. The tool also tracks patient flow and collects important public health data about trends in real time. Note that patients will see their primary care provider or another primary care provider if they do not have one.

“We are taking every step we can to ensure the Navigator is easy for primary care providers to adopt and implement for the benefit of their patients and staff,” comments Dr. Rachel Orchard. “We will provide hands-on training and other tools covering everything primary care providers need to know.”
