Public Health: What You Need to Know

COVID-19 BOOSTER DOSE RECOMMENDATION

- On July 7, Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health issued a communication to recommend individuals consider delaying receipt of a COVID-19 booster dose until the fall to ensure the expected 6-month interval from their last dose.
- Certain individuals may continue to receive a booster dose prior to fall based on their unique health status and personal situation. See the Ontario.ca website for information to support patient discussions.
- SWPH has limited appointments this summer for individuals/children seeking primary series doses or those who
 elect for booster doses in consultation with their healthcare provider. Book online at Ontario.ca/book-vaccine or

NEW TICK-BORNE DISEASES

- The Ontario Ministry of health announced three new tick-borne diseases of public health significance on July 1.
- Refer to Public Health Ontario's three new webpages to support information about these: <u>Powassan Virus</u>, <u>Babesiosis</u>, and <u>Anaplasmosis</u>.

DoPHS CHANGES FOR TICK-BORNE DISEASES

- Amendments to the Ontario Regulation to include anaplasmosis, babesiosis, and Powassan virus as Diseases of Public Health Significance (DoPHS) have been approved.
- The updated HPPA and its regulations, including Regulation 569 (Reporting) and Regulation 135/18 (Designation of Diseases) are available at: www.ontario.ca/laws/statute/90h07. Changes took effect July 1, 2023.
- Probable and confirmed cases of these diseases should be reported to the local Medical Officer of Health by the next working day. Fax a <u>reportable disease notification form</u> to 519-633-0468 or call 1-800-922-0096

ONTARIO'S IMMUNIZATION SCHEDULE

- SWPH Immunization nurses will visit your clinic to bring hard copies of the most recent Immunization Schedule in Ontario. Electronic version: Publicly Funded Immunization Schedules for Ontario June 2022 (gov.on.ca)
- This Schedule includes important resources, such as routine schedules in Ontario, catch up schedules for those who have had delays or vaccinated outside of Ontario, high-risk programs and schedules, eligibility criteria, and minimum and recommended intervals between doses for vaccine series.

STRUCTURED PSYCHOTHERAPY SUPPORT FOR ADULTS

- Ontario has free, evidence-based, limited-time CBT therapy for individuals aged 18 and older experiencing
 depressions and low mood, anxiety, PTSD, unexpected panic attacked, agoraphobia, specific fears, OCD, or
 other anxiety and stress related concerns.
- Access through self-referral or referral from a healthcare provider using the referral pathway.

BALANCED BEGINNING: A NEW CBT PROGRAM AT PUBLIC HEALTH

- Southwestern Public Health is launching a no-cost <u>new perinatal cognitive behaviour therapy program</u> this fall for individuals who are pregnant or who have a child under 18 months of age.
- This program is not intended for individuals who have pre-existing or complex mental health or psychological conditions (i.e., psychosis, bipolar disorder, etc.).
