Enteric Outbreaks

- Staff members/volunteers from facilities with active outbreaks should not work at other facilities until it has been 48 hours since they last worked at the affected facility and they are feeling well.
- Staff members/volunteers from facilities with active outbreaks who are experiencing symptoms of diarrhea and vomiting should not work at any facility until they have remained symptom free for 48 hours (72 hours if norovirus is confirmed). As per [Recommendations for the Control of Gastroenteritis Outbreaks in Long-Term Care Homes](#), March 2018.

Respiratory Outbreaks (Excluding Influenza)

- Staff members/volunteers from facilities with a respiratory outbreak should not work at other facilities until it has been 3 days since they last worked at the affected facility and they are not experiencing respiratory symptoms.
- Staff members/volunteers who are experiencing symptoms of respiratory illness should not work at any facility for 5 days from the onset of symptoms of a respiratory illness or until symptoms have resolved, whichever is shorter. As per [Control of Respiratory Infection Outbreaks in Long-Term Care Homes](#), November 2018.
- Restrictions for working at other facilities are longer for RSV and Human Metapneumovirus.

Influenza Outbreaks

- Unimmunized staff members/volunteers from facilities with active outbreaks who are not receiving prophylactic therapy (e.g. Tamiflu) should not work at any facility until it has been 3 days since they last worked at the affected facility and they are not experiencing respiratory symptoms.
- Staff members/volunteers from an affected facility who are experiencing symptoms of influenza-like illness should not work at any facility until 24 hours after all symptoms, other than a mild cough, have resolved.
- Immunized staff who are well have no restrictions on their ability to work at other facilities, provided the individual changes their uniform between facilities.

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
