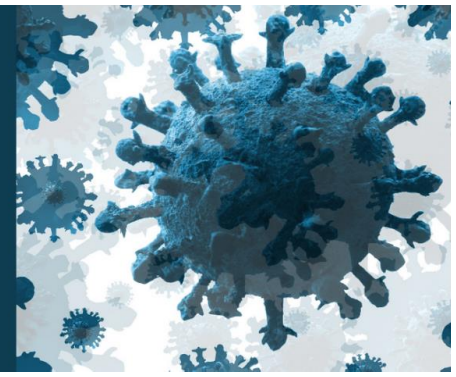

What You Need to Know This Week

1. EARLY SECOND DOSE ELIGIBILITY

- Visit www.swpublichealth.ca/eligibility for a full list of who is currently eligible.
- On June 10, these individuals will become eligible to book an earlier second dose, which is optional:
 - People aged 70 and older
 - People who had a first dose appointment on or before April 18th
- To reschedule, visit www.covidvaccineLM.ca or call 1-800-922-0096 ext. 9 to have assistance from a member of the Southwestern Public Health team.
- Individuals who have more than one appointment (such as for a family member) associated with their email address OR cell phone number will be able to re-schedule online as well.

2. REMINDER: VACCINE BRAND MIXING

- On June 3, Ontario updated its [AstraZeneca second dose guidance](#).
- Key highlights:
 - First and second dose of different COVID-19 vaccine can be safely combined.
 - Effective June 4, allow Ontarians who have received a first dose of AstraZeneca to choose either a second dose of AstraZeneca or an mRNA vaccine for their second dose.
 - Both options have been shown by NACI to be safe and provide strong protection against COVID-19; they also both will count as a completed series.
 - All second dose intervals will be provided at the recommended 12-week interval.

3. SWPH CLINICS BECOME PFIZER-EXCLUSIVE

- As of June 9, all three Southwestern Public Health mass immunization clinics will only offer Pfizer-BioNTech mRNA vaccine. [Moderna will no longer be on offer](#), due to supply issues.
- Clients residing in congregate settings like group homes, clients who are homebound/bedbound or others who were reached by our mobile vaccination team can still expect to receive Moderna for second doses in the upcoming weeks.
- No action is required for individuals who had a first dose of Moderna and will accept Pfizer.
- Those who wish to have their second dose be Moderna are encouraged to seek their second dose at pharmacy or primary care who may have supply.
- **If you have Moderna supply and appointments available, you may consider communicating with your patients so they are aware.**
