

## Most opioid-related deaths are accidental




## Accidental deaths while using alone




## Nearly 3 in 4 were unemployed at time of death




## 1 in 4 were homeless at time of death



## % of cases where naloxone was administered before death




## % of cases where resuscitation was attempted before death



# Opioid-related Harms

## Opioid-related emergency department visits




In 2021, SWPH had approximately 48 (per 100,000) more opioid-related emergency visits compared to Ontario; with an overall rate of 162.3 visits per 100,000 people (Ontario: 114 visits per 100,000).

## Opioid-related hospitalizations



In 2021, The opioid-related hospitalization rate in SWPH was nearly 2X that of the provincial rate (31.9 hospitalizations per 100,000 in SWPH vs. 16.3 across Ontario).

## Opioid-related deaths



SWPH saw a steeper increase compared to Ontario, more than doubling between 2019 and 2021. SWPH's rate increased from 8.2 deaths per 100,000 in 2019 to 21.9 deaths per 100,000 in 2021.
