

Staying Safe at Funerals



30 per cent of a venue's capacity will be allowed to attend an indoor funeral service. Funeral receptions will be limited to 50 people indoors. Services taking place outdoors will be limited to 100 attendees.



Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer when you walk in



Stay home if you are sick



If you travelled outside of Canada, you must stay home for 14 days



Keep physical distance of 6 feet (2 metres) from people that are not part of your social circle.



Do not hug or shake hands. It is best to keep our loved ones safe



Sneeze or cough into your sleeve or a tissue



Throw out used tissues right away and wash your hands



Keep surfaces clean and disinfected



If you must stay home, you can send a letter or message with a loved one



Wear a face covering in enclosed public spaces such as funeral homes or churches

Call your worship leaders and loved ones for support by phone.

If your loved one died from COVID-19 it is best that you do not touch the body.

Staying Safe at Funerals



The number of people allowed to attend an indoor funeral ceremony is a maximum of 30 per cent capacity of the ceremony venue. Funeral ceremonies taking place outdoors will be limited to 50 attendees.

Keep physical distance of 6 feet from people that are not part of your social circle.

- 1** No more than 10 people allowed at a time
- 2** Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer when you walk in
- 3** Stay home if you are sick
- 4** If you travelled outside of Canada, you must stay home for 14 days
- 5** Always stay 6 feet apart
- 6** Do not hug or shake hands. It is best to keep our loved ones safe
- 7** Sneeze or cough into your sleeve or a tissue

- 10** If you must stay home, you can send a letter or message with a loved one
