Personal plots:

The fee (or subsidy) includes a personal plot with access to common tools. Gardeners work side-by-side in the community plots for a share of the harvest. Excess produce is donated to a variety of organizations offering free meals. New in 2018: Have "waist-high" plots for anyone requiring the need.

Seed Lending Library

The St. Thomas Seed Library has a collection of seeds that are available to St. Thomas Public Library members. Members can sign out seed packets on their Library card. They can then grow the plants in their own garden and at the end of the season let a few plants 'go to seed.' Seeds are collected and returned to the Library for the same amount of seed (or more) that was borrowed.
